I attended Shanghai Normal University in Shanghai for one 2025 spring semester to study Chinese. The Swedish School in Beijing scholarship has helped this dream come true that has long been on my mind. And now these memories and experiences will always be with me. I am extremely grateful for the scholarship that made this possible financially, allowing me to focus on my studies and also make time to have fun, for example attempting some Chinese songs at KTV, and making trips to other cities.

My interest for China and the Chinese language started when I was seventeen and this year, my dream to study in China finally came true. After years of studying Chinese in Sweden I could put my Chinese to the test in more natural settings outside the classroom, while of course, still sharpening my Chinese with textbooks and grammar lessons from incredible teachers. The classes at the University were intensive and fast paced with heavy focus on advancing language proficiency.
